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# GEVA THEATRE PRESENTS Woody Sez: The Life and Music of Woody Guthrie

Tickets Now on Sale for this toe-tapping tribute to the original folk hero

Rochester, N.Y. — Geva Theatre presents its first show on the Fielding Stage – *Woody* Sez: The Life and Music of Woody Guthrie

Devised by David M. Lutken with Nick Corley and Darcie Deaville, Helen Jean Russell and Andy Teirstein, *Woody Sez* provides a glimpse into the life of Woody Guthrie.

"We are excited to welcome *Woody Sez* to our Fielding Stage, and to welcome back some familiar faces to Rochester!" says Jenni Werner, Director of Literary and Artistic Development. "Rochester native Megan Loomis, Maggie Hollinbeck (*Once*) and David Lutken (*Pump Boys and Dinettes*) are all returning to Geva to share with us Woody Guthrie's enduring songs. Audiences will surely be humming long after they leave the theatre."

Audiences will also have the opportunity to attend *Geva Insights* on February 7, 2023, a conversation between Geva's Director of Engagement, Rachel Y. DeGuzman, and G. Peter Jemison (Seneca, Heron Clan). Or, join the cast of *Woody Sez* (and bring your own instruments, voices and songs) for a Hootenanny, a musical jam session in the lobby after Sunday matinees on February 5, 12 and 13.

A poignant, toe-tapping tribute to the original folk hero. Told with his own words and music, *Woody Sez* is the story of Woody Guthrie, whose protest ballads of the '30s and '40s illuminated the beauty and struggles of the common man and inspired a new generation of American songwriters including Bob Dylan, Johnny Cash, Odetta, Ani DiFranco, and Bruce Springsteen. A cast of four actor-musicians performing multiple instruments bring Guthrie's gripping and sometimes tragic biography to life. The musical features "Bound for Glory," "Pastures of Plenty," "The Ballad of Tom Joad," "This Land is Your Land," and many more of the folk icon's enduring anthems.

Geva is thrilled to have the seasoned cast of *Woody Sez* open up the Fielding Stage. The small and talented cast have credits ranging from Geva, National Tours, Broadway, to the UK. Geva Theatre alumna Maggie Hollinbeck (who appeared in *Once*) returns to the company, along with David Lutken (*Pump Boys and Dinettes*) as well as Rochester native, Megan Loomis who appeared in *The Other Josh Cohen* (Wilson Stage) and *The Road to Where* (Fielding Stage). The production is directed by Nick Corley, and the creative team includes music director David Lutken, scenic designer Luke Hegel-Cantarella, costume designer Jeffrey Meek and lighting designer Emily Stork.
