GEVA THEATRE ANNOUNCES THE LINE-UP FOR THE 23/24 SEASON

Sponsored by ESL Federal Credit Union Honorary Season Producer Dr. Dawn Lipson

Rochester, N.Y. — Following on Geva's 50th Anniversary Season, which brought two *New York Times* Critic's Pick productions and an Obie Award winning new play to Rochester, along with exciting new productions of family favorites, Geva Theatre's Artistic Director Elizabeth Williamson and Executive Director Christopher Mannelli are delighted to announce the 2023/2024 Season.

"I've been loving my first year at Geva Theatre, and getting to know folks here in Rochester and the surrounding area, so much!" said Artistic Director Elizabeth Williamson. "The season planning committee and I have put together a lineup of shows for next year that I can't wait to share with you all. We've got some of the most exciting directors and writers in the field joining us to bring an amazing array of stories – from world premieres to reimagined classics and family favorites – to life for our audiences."

The season begins with *The Wizard Of Oz,* opening the Wilson Stage in September. **Zi Alikhan,** who directed Geva's production of *Somewhere* last season, will put a new spin on the classic musical based on the movie. Second up on the Wilson Stage will be **Vanessa Severo**'s one woman Frida Kahlo show, *Frida... A Self Portrait*, directed by **Joanie Schultz**. Following the production of *Frida... A Self Portrait*, we open up the

doors of the Fielding Stage with Boston Playwrights' Theatre's production of *Mr. Parent*, written by **Melinda Lopez** with **Maurice Emmanuel Parent** about his experience as a teacher in the Boston schools, and conceived with and directed by **Megan Sandberg-Zakian**.

Diving head-first into the new year, we begin with an exciting new version of Frederick Knott's thrilling murder mystery, *Dial M For Murder*, adapted by Jeffrey Hatcher and directed by Rachel Alderman. Next up is a world premiere musical, *I Put A Spell On You*. Written by Geva's Playwright in Residence, Harrison David Rivers, with music arranged by Nubya Garcia, and produced in partnership with Barney Wragg, the musical tells the story of the life and music of the legendary Nina Simone. The fifth slot on the Wilson Stage goes to *Newtown*, a world premiere play written by Dan O'Brien and directed by Artistic Director Elizabeth Williamson.

Rounding out the Fielding Stage is the Kitchen Theatre's production of *Sanctuary City*, written by **Martyna Majok**, sharing the story of two Dreamers and best friends fighting to stay in the United States. Closing the 23/24 season is a co-production with Theater Latté Da of the musical *The Color Purple*, based on the novel by **Alice Walker**, with book by Marsha Norman, and music and lyrics by Brenda Russell, Allee Willis, and Stephen Bray, and directed by **Kelli Foster Warder**.

For our 23/24 season we are happy to announce that actor, writer, and comedian **Baron Vaughn** will be joining Geva as our next Artist in Residence. Baron begins a two year residency and will overlap with our current Playwright in Residence, Harrison David Rivers. Vaughn will curate a comedy series in the Fielding (dates and comedians TBA), as well as working on a newly commissioned piece, and will join Geva's season planning committee for the following season.

"We are thrilled to be sharing this remarkable season of productions with the community," said Geva Executive Director Christopher Mannelli. "We are so thankful to all who have supported Geva and continue to make our theatre a vibrant hub for the arts in downtown Rochester!"

Geva's 23/24 season was curated by Geva's season planning committee which includes Rachel DeGuzman, Patrick Heydenburg, Fiona Kyle, Christopher Mannelli, Harrison David Rivers, Jenni Werner, and Elizabeth Williamson.

A struggling actor turns to teaching for a steady paycheck, thinking "how hard could it be?" It doesn't take long to realize that the answer is somewhere between "very" and "impossible." But then – as he careens from the Boston Public Schools by day to serious thespian at night – Mr. Parent starts to wonder where he really belongs. *Mr. Parent* is a deeply felt and hilarious solo performance about crushingly inequitable systems, the brilliance of every kid, and how we might all find the space to be ourselves.

I Put A Spell On You By Harrison David Rivers Music Arranged by Nubya Garcia Wilson Stage March 5 – March 31, 2024

From the sticky-keyed upright at Luke C.M.E Church in Fort Tryon, North Carolina, to the sleek concert grand at Carnegie Hall, Nina Simone never met a piano she couldn't make sing; or a song she couldn't transform with her signature artistry and unique sound. *I Put a Spell on You*, a brand-new musical, tells the story of one of the 20th century's most influential recording artists – her loves, losses, triumphs, defeats – and celebrates her extraordinary gifts and indomitable spirit. Written by GLAAD and Relentless Award winner Harrison David Rivers, with musical arrangements by Jazz FM UK Jazz Act of the Year Award winner Nubya Garcia, *I Put a Spell on You* features some of Simone's greatest hits, including "Little Girl Blue", "Feeling Good", "To Be Young, Gifted and Black", "Sinnerman", and so many more.

Sanctuary City By Martyna Majok A Kitchen Theatre Production Fielding Stage March 20 – April 7, 2024

From Pulitzer Prize-winner Martyna Majok comes this poignant and invigorating drama. Teenagers B and G are best friends and Dreamers, fighting to stay in America – the only home they've ever known. When she is naturalized, they hatch a plan to keep him here, but as time hurdles on, the challenges mount and threaten their friendship. Can they save each other – and their friendship – or will the risks be too great?

Newtown By Dan O'Brien Directed by Elizabeth Williamson Wilson Stage April 16 – May 12, 2024

The Oregon Shakespeare Festival and the Public Theater co-commissioned Dan O'Brien to write a play about the place of guns in our country's story, as part of American Revolutions: The United States History Cycle. The resulting play engages with recent history: the prologue and aftermath of the shooting at Sandy Hook Elementary School in Newtown, Connecticut, in 2012.

Derived closely from documentary source material, the play is at once lyrical and unflinchingly realistic. A heartbreaking and powerful interrogation of the complex causes of gun violence in our culture, *Newtown* offers in the end the possibility of healing and hope.

The Color Purple By Alice Walker Book by Marsha Norman Directed by Kelli Foster Warder Music & Lyrics by Brenda Russell, Allee Willis, and Stephen Bray Co-production with Theater Latté Da Wilson Stage May 28 – June 23, 2024

Based on the Pulitzer Prize-winning novel by Alice Walker and adapted for the stage by Pulitzer Prize and Tony Award-winner Marsha Norman, *The Color Purple* tells the story of courageous heroine Celie, as she journeys through joy, despair, anguish and hope in her own personal awakening to discover her unique voice in the world. This intimate version of this landmark musical celebrates life, love, and finding the strength to stand up for who you are and what you believe in.

Baron Vaughn's Comedy Series Fielding Stage

Join us on the Fielding stage throughout the season on dates to be announced as Geva's incoming Artist in Residence, Baron Vaughn, curates a new long-form comedy series where the audience gets to watch some of the country's most exciting comedians develop new long-form comedy material live with the Rochester community.

Baron Vaughn is a force to be reckoned with in the world of entertainment. With a career that spans live comedy, acting, and directing, Baron's talent knows no bounds. As an actor, he's best known as "Bud", sharing the screen with Jane Fonda and Lily Tomlin on the longest-running hit Netflix series, *Grace & Frankie*. Baron lends his voice as "Tom Servo" in the recent seasons of cult-hit, *Mystery Science Theater 3000*.

He's also a creative force behind the scenes, co-creating and co-hosting the groundbreaking Comedy Central showcase variety series *The New Negroes with Open Mike Eagle*. The show shined a light on both established and rising Black artists in comedy and music. In 2020, Baron continued to push boundaries with *Call & Response*, a limited series produced by Blavity and Funny or Die. Baron's deeply personal project *Fatherless*, directed by the award-winning Dawn Porter, explores the impact of absent fathers on families and communities while he also endeavored to finally connect with his own absent father.

As a stand-up comedian, Baron has been entertaining audiences for more than 20 years. He has two influential comedy recordings, *Raised by Cable* and *Blaxistential Crisis*, both available for streaming on all platforms. Baron's headlining performances at major clubs and colleges throughout the US have led him to perform at renowned festivals including *Just for Laughs* (Montreal & Vancouver), *Life Is Beautiful* (Las Vegas), and the *New York Comedy Festival*.

Baron's directorial debut, the short film "So Much To Do" featuring Toni Trucks, can be seen in the horror anthology, *Scare Package*, on Shudder. Baron holds a BFA in Acting from Boston University.
