we are continuous tells the story of Simon and his mother, Ora, who have always been close. She's been his champion, his defender, and his friend. But when a life-changing secret comes to light, can their bond survive? Can love heal what's broken between them? *we are continuous* is a tender, heartbreaking and hopeful story about how people change and how love evolves.

"Geva presented *we are continuous* as an audio drama as part of Recognition Radio back in 2020 and I'm thrilled to now be bringing it to the Fielding Stage," says playwright Harrison David Rivers. "Rochester has become very dear to me and I'm super excited to share the play with the community."

"I couldn't be more excited to be producing Geva Playwright in Residence Harrison David Rivers' beautiful *we are continuous* here in Rochester," says Artistic Director Elizabeth Williamson. "Harrison, along with director Tyler Thomas, have assembled an extraordinary team to tell this compelling story, which I believe will resonate with anyone who has a complex relationship with a child – or a parent!"

Brenda Pressley (*Dreamgirls*, Broadway; TV: *Brewster Place* with Oprah Winfrey) will be reprising her role as Mother after performing it at Williamstown Theatre Festival in 2022. Tom Holcomb (*Meet Me in St. Louis*, Irish Repertory Theatre), last seen at Geva in *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, will also reprise his role of Husband from the Williamstown Theatre Festival. Rounding out the cast is Teddy Trice (*The Book of Mormon*, Broadway; Film: *The Vetting*) as Son.

HARRISON DAVID RIVERS (Playwright) Harrison David Rivers is an award-winning playwright, librettist and television writer based in St. Paul, Minnesota. She is also the Associate Artistic Director of One Nation/One Project, a national arts and wellness initiative in partnership with the National League of Cities.
