NOVEL CORONAVIRUS UPDATE: GEVA CANCELS REMAINING PERFORMANCES OF ONCE AND CRY IT OUT

Following Governor Cuomo's directive, effective at 5pm today, all remaining performances of ONCE and CRY IT OUT will be cancelled.

Geva to provide video access of Once and Cry It Out.

Geva will provide updates on future performances and events an on ongoing basis.

Rochester, N.Y., March 13, 2020 – Geva's first priority is to adhere to the measures outlined by public officials to ensure the safety and well-being of patrons, casts, staff and the general public. Following on the Governor's directive yesterday limiting attendance at live events, effective at 5pm today, Geva will be cancelling all remaining performances of *Once* and *Cry It Out*.

For those patrons who have tickets to performances of *Once* and *Cry It Out* from March 13 through March 22, we are offering the following options:

- Receive access to videos of Geva's productions of *Once* and *Cry It Out*. (Details will be available next week).
- Receive a credit toward a future production at Geva in our current season, toward a 2020-2021 Season Subscription, or toward single tickets when they become available.
- Donate the value of your ticket(s) as a tax-deductible contribution. Transferring your ticket to a donation supports Geva during these uncertain times. We will continue to

pay our artists and staff during this crisis and your donation will help the theatre meet

these obligations.

The Box Office will be contacting ticket holders in the coming days to make arrangements for

these options.

It is absolutely understandable that many of those who have purchased tickets to both *Once*

and Cry It Out may wish to seek refunds. However, as a non-profit theatre, this can have a

devastating impact on the theatre. We know how much patrons love Geva! The theatre is

incredible grateful to continue to be part of patrons' lives and the cultural life of Rochester for

over 47 years. The theatre is asking patrons to consider one of the aforementioned options in

place of a refund.

At Geva, we believe in taking care of one another and we ask you to continue to take care of

each other, too. We will continue to monitor the situation and provide ongoing updates on the

remaining productions of the 2019-2020 season on both our website and through social

media. (Also, keep your eyes out for news on the theatre's exciting 2020-2021 Season which

will be announced next week!)
