Geva Theatre Center presents world-premiere musical 'Somewhere Over the Border'

New work based on real-life migration story and 'The Wizard of Oz' runs March 30 – April 24

Rochester, N.Y. – Geva audiences will be some of the first to experience an ambitious original musical when the theatre opens the world-premiere production of "Somewhere Over the Border" on Wednesday, March 30. Created by Brian Quijada (book, music, and lyrics) and directed by Rebecca Martínez, the production runs through April 24 on Geva's Wilson Stage. Geva is co-producing the premiere along with Syracuse Stage and Teatro Vista, Theatre with a View in Chicago.

Inspired by the real-life journey of Quijada's mother, Reina, from El Salvador to the U.S. and L. Frank Baum's classic tale "The Wonderful Wizard of Oz," "Somewhere Over the Border" embraces the factual and the fantastical in its depiction of one young girl's pursuit of the American dream. As Reina travels north to the Mexican border, she gathers friends, faces down dangers, and holds tight to the memory of the little boy she left behind. Set in the 1970s and propelled by cumbia, Mexican mariachi boleros, American rock and hip hop, the musical is both fable and family history — and a testament to the determination born of love. Syracuse.com called it "a sweet, sometimes bracing reminder of the lengths people will go to survive." Ithaca.com said, "The cast simply sparkles, the action never flags, and the music is upbeat."

Geva audiences may be familiar with Quijada. In February 2021, the theatre co-presented the playwright, actor, and composer's autobiographical one-man show "Where Did We Sit on the Bus?" in on-demand video format. The broadcast production, produced by Bitter Jester Studios, was nominated for three regional Emmys, including Outstanding Achievement in Writing. "Somewhere Over the Border" is another deeply personal work for Quijada, who describes it as a mashup of his mother's border crossing story and "The Wizard of Oz." While he had been told the story of Reina's journey as a child, it wasn't until a chance conversation with his mother a couple years ago that Quijada learned all of the harrowing details. "It was an epic story — epic. I couldn't even put the whole thing into the play, and I was like, 'Oh, my God, this is a classic story,'" he explained in an interview with Syracuse Stage. "At first, I thought it was 'The Odyssey,' and then it kind of clicked, especially with the people she met along the way. It was 'The Wizard of Oz."

The show is helmed by Rebecca Martínez, an award-winning director and choreographer who is passionate about advancing Latinx representation in theatre. "Determination, resilience, courage, love, hope, joy. These are just a few words that I think of when I listen to Reina's story. I think of the remarkable journey she and many, many others have made, leaving their homes, facing risk and dangers, coming to a new country that promises much and takes much in return," says Martínez. "It is an honor and a privilege to help tell this story."

A cast of six and an onstage band of four musicians bring the production to life: Robert Ariza (Adán, Cruz), Gloria Vivica Benavides (Antonia, Leona), Tanya De León (Reina), Francisca Muñoz (Julia), Bobby Plasencia (Don Napoleon, Silvano), Arusi Santi (Narrator), Ben Meixell (Keyboard), Matt Pinto (Guitar), and Freddy Colon (Percussion) and Hector Diaz (Bass) of Rochester's premier Latin jazz band Mambo Kings. Julián Mesri (Music Director), Tanya Orellana (Scenic Designer), Asa Benally (Costume Designer), Jennifer Fok (Lighting Designer), Jacqueline R. Herter (Sound Designer), Sofia Ubilla (Associate Director), Kristin Leahey (Dramaturg), Sarah Pool Wilhelm (Assistant Music Director, Copyist), Katherine Thesing (Stage Manager), and Nolan Todd (Assistant Stage Manager) complete the creative team.
