Now, she comes to life onstage through playwright and performer Vanessa Severo. *Frida... A Self Portrait* transports you to La Casa Azul, Frida's home, where Vanessa recounts the artist's bold life. With music and movement, she shares insights about Frida's physical limitations, complex love life, addictions and, of course, the beauty in her art. This searing new play cracks open a powerful portal between Vanessa and Frida bringing breathtaking physicality and raw honesty to this stunningly creative production.

Teenagers B and G are best friends and Dreamers, fighting to stay in America – the only home they've ever known. When she is naturalized, they hatch a plan to keep him here, but as time hurdles on, the challenges mount and threaten their friendship. Can they save each other – and their friendship – or will the risks be too great?

- Tickets may be reserved by contacting Olivia Spenard at 585-420-2052. Reservations can only be made via phone (*No reservations will be accepted via email*).
- All student matinees tickets are \$20 per ticket .
- 1 complimentary chaperone ticket is included for every 15 student tickets purchased.
- Final confirmation of ticket numbers is due three (3) weeks in advance of the Student Matinee performance.

• All payments must be received in full by two (2) weeks prior to the date of the performance. **Reservations that will only provide payment after the performance takes place (including from a third party) will not be accepted.**

- Student Matinees begin promptly at 10:30am. Groups are advised to coordinate their transportation to arrive at 10am and depart at approximately 1pm (varying by show), following the post-show talkback with cast members.
- All Student Matinees include:
 - **Teacher Preview:** Teachers who would like to attend a performance prior to bringing a group to a Student Matinee may request a complimentary preview ticket (for lead teacher(s) only).
 - **Discovery Guide:** Packed with information about the play, relevant context, suggested discussion questions, and related activities, the Discovery Guide unlocks every production's essential issues and avenues for classroom exploration.
 - **Discovery Workshops:** A professional artist-educator will travel to your school to explore the play's themes and production values, and inspire curiosity for the production. These interactive workshops are free, easy to schedule, take place in your own classroom and, most importantly, make a personal connection with students before they come to the theatre. (Discovery Workshops are not offered for *A Christmas Carol*).
 - Post-Show Talkback: Performances are immediately followed by a conversation with cast members so that students may respond to the performance and ask questions.
