

Geva Theatre announces the lineup for the 24/25 Season Thrilling partnerships, new programs, and more! Sponsored by ESL Federal Credit Union Honorary Season Producer Dr. Dawn Lipson

Rochester, N.Y. — Geva Theatre's Artistic Director Elizabeth Williamson, Executive Director James Haskins, and Curation Team (Rachel Y. DeGuzman, Fiona Kyle, Harrison David Rivers, and Baron Vaughn) are delighted to announce Geva's 2024/2025 season, programming, partnerships, and events as they roll out **One Geva**: a new vision for the company that encompasses productions, education, and engagement programming throughout the year on and off Geva's stages.

"This coming year at Geva will see extraordinary stories onstage, from August Wilson's powerful memoir play *How I Learned What I Learned*, which takes us back through the creation of his Century Cycle, to Harrison David Rivers' new adaptation of *A Christmas Carol*, to Christina Ham's stunning and searing *Nina Simone: Four Women*, to a fresh take on Louisa May Alcott's *Little Women*. We'll bookend the season with great musicals: beginning with a hilarious new production of **Mel Brooks' Young Frankenstein** and ending with *Beautiful: The Carole King Musical*," said Artistic Director Elizabeth Williamson.

"We'll deepen our partnership with Friends of Ganondagan and Natives Voices; after working with them to bring *The Mush Hole* and the Indigenous Theatre Symposium to Rochester this summer, we're partnering with them on the East Coast Premiere of Vickie Ramirez' wonderful Haudenosaunee dramatic comedy *Pure Native*. We'll also launch new summer programming this year featuring Hershey Felder in *George Gershwin Alone*," Williamson continued. "Outside of our mainstage programming, we'll see the return of Baron Vaughn's comedy-in-process series *The Work Out Room*, and we'll once again go to La Marketa for the Latinx Art and Culture Celebration, this year featuring Borinquen's *Pedro and the Wolf.*"

New to the 24/25 Season, Geva is unifying all of our spaces with our **One Geva** subscription. The **One Geva** subscription offers a full season of exciting work across our two stages – five shows in the Wilson and one in the Fielding. It features equally significant and inspiring work across all spaces with the same production values and the same level of excellence in artistry.

James Haskins, Executive Director, adds, "As Geva Theatre's new Executive Director, I'm thrilled to join with Elizabeth Williamson to announce such an exciting and diverse lineup for the 2024/25 Season. More students will be able to join us at the theatre with extended weeks for student matinees of *A Christmas Carol* and *Little Women*, and thanks to the City, the ROC Geva Pass will bring 200 Rochester residents free of charge to every mainstage show in the season. Speaking of students, we are thrilled to announce that the Geva-Brockport Alliance will continue

for the next five years! We have loved having their students with us at Geva and are so happy to be continuing our partnership with SUNY Brockport. We so appreciate the extraordinary support of our sponsors, ESL Federal Credit Union and Dr. Dawn Lipson, and look forward to welcoming new and returning audiences to our Wilson and Fielding Stages as we celebrate One Geva."

The season launches with Mel Brooks' *Young Frankenstein*, opening on the Wilson Stage in September. Stuart Ross, writer and director of *Forever Plaid*, directs this co-production with Berkshire Theatre Group and Bay Street Theater. Second up on the Fielding Stage will be August Wilson's *How I Learned What I Learned*, a theatrical memoir by one of America's most acclaimed playwrights.

The new year begins on the Wilson Stage with Christina Ham's *Nina Simone: Four Women*, a play with music, which follows Simone as she writes her Civil Rights anthem, "Mississippi Goddam." Next up on the Wilson is Heather Chrisler's adaptation of Louisa May Alcott's beloved novel, *Little Women*.

The season continues on the Wilson Stage with the East Coast Premiere of dramatic comedy *Pure Native* by Vickie Ramirez (Tuscarora), directed by Randy Reinholz (Choctaw), produced in association with Friends of Ganondagan and Native Voices. Closing the 24/25 Season is the Tony Award-winning *Beautiful: The Carole King Musical* with book by the late Tony- and Oscar-nominated Douglas McGrath, and words and music by the seminal pop music writing teams Gerry Goffin and Carole King, and Barry Mann and Cynthia Weil. Karen Azenberg, Artistic Director of Pioneer Theatre Company, directs this co-production with Pioneer.

In addition to our season, we will feature two exciting add-on productions as well as our comedy-in-process series!

In July 2024, the theatre will bring new summer programming to Rochester with Hershey Felder's *George Gershwin Alone*, which has played on Broadway, in the West End, and internationally to great acclaim. Pre-sale tickets are available now for 24/25 Season Subscribers at a discounted rate of 20% off! This discount is valid through April 21, after which 24/25 Subscribers will enjoy 15% off. Coming to the Wilson Stage in November 2024, we are excited to present a new production of Charles Dickens' *A Christmas Carol*. This world premiere adaptation from Geva's 2022-24 Artist in Residence Harrison David Rivers will be directed by Artistic Director Elizabeth Williamson. Filled with humor, heart, hope – and a little bit of horror – *A Christmas Carol* reminds us that it is never too late to have a change of heart.

We are happy to announce that DeLanna Studi, whose work was seen last year at Geva with her one-woman show *And So We Walked: An Artist's Journey Along the Trail of Tears*, will be our 2024-26 Artist in Residence! Our 2023-25 Artist in Residence, actor, writer, and comedian Baron Vaughn will continue to curate his comedy series, *The Work Out Room*, which will return

in March and June of 2025 with all new comedians. Each Artist in Residence serves on our Senior Leadership, Curation, and Strategic Planning teams.

Geva's 24/25 season was curated by Geva's Curation Team: Rachel Y. DeGuzman, Fiona Kyle, Harrison David Rivers, Baron Vaughn, and Elizabeth Williamson.

Nina Simone: Four Women

September 16, 1963. When Nina Simone heard that four Black girls had been killed in the bombing of the 16th Avenue Church in Birmingham, Alabama, her first impulse was to try and build a zip gun; instead she channeled her rage into "Mississippi Goddamn," the song that marked the emergence of Nina Simone, the Civil Rights activist. Infused with traditional hymns along with songs including "Four Women," "I Loves You, Porgy," and "Young, Gifted and Black," *Nina Simone: Four Women* looks at an artist and the women around her as their journey leads them down a path of discovery and healing.

Little Women

Louisa May Alcott's classic novel comes to fresh life in this inventive, theatrical adaptation which follows as the March sisters – Meg, Jo, Beth, and Amy – gather in the family attic. From making up fairy stories, writing for their pretend newspaper, and playing make believe, they graduate to scenes of love, loss, and – for Jo – artistic self-discovery, as they come of age against the backdrop of the American Civil War.

This free event will feature *Pedro and the Wolf*, reimagined by Jayme Bermudez, Andrew Rodriuez, and Adrian Franco – performed by Borinquen dancers to live music. Tania-Day Magallon and Victor RANGE Zarate will install artwork and lead community artmaking. Engagement at Geva programs also include Geva *Insights*, Mondays at Geva, the Essie Calhoun Diversity in the Arts Awards, symposiums and more. Dates and events will be announced on the company's website through the season.

Education at Geva

Education at Geva will include student matinee performances of *A Christmas Carol, Nina Simone: Four Women, Little Women, Pure Native*, and *Beautiful.* We will also hold a five-week Musical Theatre Summer Academy conservatory training program for young actors ages 12-18 in July of 2025. Program and Audition information will be released in January, and full and partial need-based scholarships will be available.

For over twenty years, SUNY Brockport has been a wonderful partner to Geva Theatre in nurturing students through professional artistic experiences in the Geva-Brockport Alliance, and we are thrilled to continue our alliance with them! Each semester, SUNY Brockport students engage with Geva's staff and visiting artists through performance opportunities, internships, show attendance, workshops, facilitated conversations, classes, and more. Many of these students have gone on to work at Geva as full-time staff members, as performers on our stages, and at theatres across the country.

Other Geva Education programs will center on expanding in-school workshops, classes in Geva's Fielding Stage, college internships in performance and with behind-the-scenes departments at Geva for students at multiple institutions throughout the greater Rochester region, and expanded accessibility.
