Geva Theatre closes its 51st Season with the Tony Award-winning Musical, *The Color Purple*On stage May 28 - June 29

A Co-Production with Theater Latté Da

Rochester, N.Y. — Geva Theatre brings its 51st season to a close with *The Color Purple*. Based on the Pulitzer Prize-winning novel by Alice Walker and adapted for the stage by Pulitzer Prize and Tony Award-winner Marsha Norman, with music and lyrics by Brenda Russell, Allee Willis, and Stephen Bray, *The Color Purple* tells the story of courageous heroine Celie, as she journeys through joy, despair, anguish, and hope in her own personal awakening to discover her unique voice in the world. This intimate version of the landmark musical celebrates life, love, and the strength to stand up for who you are and what you believe in. Running on the Wilson Stage May 28 – June 29, *The Color Purple* is directed by **Daniel J. Bryant**, Choreographed by **Heather Himes**, with Music Direction by **Sanford Moore**. Artistic Director Elizabeth Williamson said "I am so delighted to welcome Daniel Bryant back to Geva after his beautiful production of *How To Catch Creation* a couple years ago. Daniel, Heather, Sanford, and the team have built a beautiful production of this play, and we can't wait to share it with audiences here in Rochester following their lauded run in the Twin Cities."

Director Daniel J. Bryant shared, "Our telling of *The Color Purple* is uniquely special because it is intuitively created from 'scratch' without seeing any previous productions. [Our production is] led by Spirit and centered on healing, love and joy to tell this classic story of resilience – of finding strength in one's self in order to soar in the truth of love."

The Creative Team:

Director **Daniel J. Bryant** (he/him) returns to Geva Theatre after directing *How to Catch Creation* during the 49th Season. Some of Bryant's recent directing credits include *the ripple, the wave that carried me home* (Portland Center Stage and Artists Repertory Theatre), the World Premiere production of *ABCD* at Barrington Stage Company, *What To Send Up When It Goes Down* (Congo Square Theatre), and *Feeding Beatrice* (St. Louis Rep). Previously serving as Associate Producer/Director of community programs at Baltimore Center Stage under the leadership of Artistic Directors Kwame Kwei-Armah and Hana Sharif, Daniel designed BCS's Mobile Unit program, producing and directing *Antigone, Twelfth Night*, and *Endgame*, as well as directing *A Wonder In My Soul* for the main stage.
