A Christmas Carol at Geva Theatre – presented by KeyBank A refreshed adaptation of Dickens' Classic Story Rochester's holiday tradition begins November 23

Rochester, N.Y. — *A Christmas Carol,* presented by KeyBank, returns to Geva Theatre in an all new adaptation by award-winning playwright **Harrison David Rivers**, in collaboration with **Sally Lobel**. Based on the classic by Charles Dickens, this adaptation begins with a wish made by young Tim Cratchit. Over the course of one night, notorious grump Ebenezer Scrooge is visited by four ghosts, but will their intervention prompt him to change his "humbug" ways? Filled with humor, heart, hope – and a little bit of horror – *A Christmas Carol* reminds us that it is never too late to have a change of heart. This production is directed by Geva's Artistic Director **Elizabeth Williamson** and runs November 23 - December 29, 2024. Since 1985, *A Christmas Carol* has been a beloved holiday tradition in Rochester. Over the past four decades the company has presented three different adaptations and is thrilled to share this World Premiere from Harrison David Rivers, who wrote this adaptation in collaboration with Dramaturg **Sally Lobel**. This new production features period costumes by Costume Designer **Ilona Somogyi**, whose costumes Geva audiences will remember from *Jane Eyre*, a mixture of traditional carols, and a brand new set inspired by Victorian London by Scenic Designer **Se Hyun Oh**.

Playwright Harrison David Rivers shared, "Charles Dickens knew what he was doing. Nearly 200 years ago, he wrote a story that we continue to tell today. And why? Because humor, horror, heart, and hope are timeless. It has been an honor to adapt Dickens' classic tale for the present moment. We can't wait to share it with the Rochester community!"

"I'm so thrilled to be working with a wonderful mix of new and longstanding collaborators on this simultaneously effervescent, compelling, and yes, occasionally scary, new production of *A Christmas Carol*," said Director and Artistic Director Elizabeth Williamson. "It's an honor to be shepherding Harrison and Sally's vision of a *Carol* that truly is for all of us to the stage for the first time."

Michael Preston (he/him), who played the role of Ebenezer Scrooge in two previous versions of A Christmas Carol, both at Geva in 2022 and 2023, and before that at Hartford Stage, will be returning as Scrooge in this new production (former member of The Flying Karamazov Brothers, including three stints on Broadway). Joining him in the cast are Sommer Carbuccia (he/him) as Ghost of Christmas Future and Solicitor (A Christmas Carol, Geva 2018; Riverdale), Blake Hamilton Currie (he/him) as Apprentice Scrooge (Twelfth Night, Chicago Shakespeare), Tom Holcomb (he/him) as Fred, Mr. Fezziwig, and Ghost of Christmas Present (we are continuous, Geva 2023), Carman Lacivita (he/him) as Bob Cratchit and Marley (Broadway: Marvin's Room, Off-Broadway: To My Girls), Sujaya Sunkara (she/they) as Belle (Cowboys and East Indians, Denver Center), Esther Winter (she/her) as Mrs. Cratchit and Mrs. Fezziwig (A Christmas Carol, Geva 2023), and Imani Youngblood (she/they) as Fan, Martha, and Ghost of Christmas Past (Hood, Asolo Repertory Theatre). The role of Tim Cratchit will be played by Reid A. Antal (he/him) and Adriana Ruya Venable (she/her). The remaining ensemble includes: Evan Burmeister (he/they), Colin Cedeño (he/him), Rachel Ekstrom (she/her/he/him), Willow Sky Fisher (she/her), Frederick R. Hawkins (she/her), Lauren Hochreiter, Rosemary Laprime (she/her), Millicent Mahar (she/they), Deonne Major (he/him), George Martone, Gabriel Pierce (he/him), Nailah Rollins (she/her), Julia Schubbe (she/her), Kaley Sumeriski (she/her), Kit Wanek, Aurora Wantuch (she/her), with Swings Kai Hoag (he/they) and Sydney Johnson (she/her).

This World Premiere Commission is adapted by Harrison David Rivers (he/him; we are continuous at Geva) in collaboration with Dramaturg Sally Lobel (she/her) and Directed by Elizabeth Williamson (she/her; OBIE Award for Russian Troll Farm; TheaterWorks / TheatreSquared / The Civilians; Jane Eyre and Newtown at Geva), with musical direction by Don Kot (he/him; A Christmas Carol and Sister Act at Geva) and choreography by Ashleigh King (she/her; Helen Hayes Award for Legally Blonde at Keegan). The rest of the creative team includes Scenic Designer Se Hyun Oh (he/him; Clyde's, Cincinnati Playhouse), Costume Designer Ilona Somogyi (she/her; Jane Eyre at Geva), Lighting Designer Nic Vincent (he/him; The Salvagers, Yale Rep), Sound Designer and Composer André Pluess (The Minutes, Broadway), Associate Sound Designer Andrew Mark Wilhelm (he/him), Wig Designer Emma Gustafson (she/her), Dialect Coach Thom Miller (he/him), and Associate Director Jasmine B. Gunter (she/her). The Rehearsal Stage Manager is Colt Luedtke and the Production Stage Manager is Jack Meister-Lopez (he/they) with Assistant Stage Managers Shannon Toot

(she/her) and **Julia Bregy** (she/her). Casting Directors **Danielle Pretsfelder Demchick**, CSA (she/her) and **Elizabeth Hay**.
