Come home to Geva with heartfelt family dramas, a mystery, comedies, a musical, and a world premiere from one of our Artists in Residence.

Geva is expanding its One Geva subscription series, a full season of exciting work across our two stages – five shows in the Wilson and now two in the Fielding. It features equally significant and inspiring work across all spaces with the same production values and the same level of excellence in artistry.

"As we put together our 2025/26 Season, we found themes of home emerging across our programming: from sisters connecting over a family recipe, to newlyweds moving into a new apartment together, to a young woman searching for a sense of belonging – a sense of *home*, *love*, and *family*", said Artistic Director Elizabeth Williamson. "We're also delighted to welcome back home to Geva a number of artists whose work has already had great impact here in the past, including playwright Christin Eve Cato, director Rachel Alderman, and writer, actor, and comedian Baron Vaughn. We're excited to invite old friends, new collaborators, and audiences alike to come home to Geva."

James Haskins, Executive Director, adds "Elizabeth and I look forward to expanding upon the One Geva philosophy announced last year to further enhance the 2025/26 subscription series programming and beyond. We will share a variety of stories, experiences, and perspectives on both of our stages and in partnership with the multiple communities of Greater Rochester. We are grateful for our Season Sponsor ESL Federal Credit Union and Honorary Season Producer Dr. Dawn Lipson for their continued support, along with our dedicated Board of Trustees and all Geva supporters who make the work we produce on our stages possible."

Geva will kick off the season in September on the Wilson Stage with *The Play That Goes Wrong* by Henry Lewis, Jonathan Sayer & Henry Shields. Next, on the Fielding Stage, will be Christin Eve Cato's *Sancocho*. In the new year, we return to the Wilson Stage with *Susan Hill's The Woman in Black*, adapted by Stephen Mallatratt, directed by Robin Herferd, and produced by Pemberley Productions. Next up on the Wilson is *Barefoot in the Park* by Neil Simon. The season continues on the Wilson with *Furlough's Paradise* by a.k. payne, winner of the 2025 Susan Smith Blackburn Prize. Then on the Fielding Stage will be the World Premiere

Commission of 23/25 Artist in Residence Baron Vaughn's solo play *Baron Vaughn: Cycle Breaker*. Closing the 25/26 Season is *Anastasia: The Musical*, with book by Terrence McNally, music by Stephen Flaherty, lyrics by Lynn Ahrens, inspired by the Twentieth Century Fox Motion Pictures, by special arrangement with Buena Vista Theatrical, and from the play by Marcelle Maurette as adapted by Guy Bolton.

In addition to the season, there are two exciting special productions. Tickets are on sale now for *Always...Patsy Cline*, created and originally directed by Ted Swindley, coming to the Wilson Stage July 2025. Then in November of 2025, *A Christmas Carol* adapted by Harrison David Rivers in collaboration with Sally Lobel, returns to the Wilson Stage.

Susan Hill's The Woman in Black

The second longest-running play in the history of the West End, *The Woman in Black* is a chilling drama, adapted by Stephen Mallatratt from the 1983 novel by Susan Hill. Mallatratt conjured a complete world into which generations of young people have entered, surrendering to the ultimate magic of theatre: their own imaginations. A dark and scary mystery unfolds as an old man recounts the events of his youth when he went to the fog-embanked countryside of England to settle the estate of a family shrouded in a tragedy that continues to haunt (literally!) anyone who comes too close.

Barefoot in the Park

Opposites attract in Neil Simon's celebrated romantic comedy. Newlyweds Paul, a straight-laced lawyer, and Corie, a free-spirit, have barely returned from their honeymoon, and their marriage is already on the fritz, like the telephone line in their new apartment. Corie wants Paul to be more spontaneous and do things like run "barefoot in the park," and Paul just wants to get a good night's sleep. When Corie's prim and proper mother drops by for an unexpected visit, and their eccentric upstairs neighbor, Mr. Velasco, climbs in through their upstairs window, hilarity ensues! This slice of newlywed life is sure to remind even long-married couples of the pleasures and perils of falling in love.

Furlough's Paradise

Winner of the 2025 Susan Smith Blackburn Prize and Winner of the 20th Annual Alliance/Kendeda National Graduate Playwriting Competition. On a three-day furlough for her mother's funeral, Sade stays with her only cousin. Mina is also on a brief reprieve from her life on the West Coast, and the cousins, who were once so close, come together to try to make sense of grief, home, and kinship as time ticks toward Sade's return to prison. "An abolition play or simply a play about cousins" from one of America's most promising new playwrights.

Baron Vaughn: Cycle Breaker

Part stand-up comedy, part memory play, *Baron Vaughn: Cycle Breaker* is a meditation on family and what it takes to truly break a cycle.

Connectivity at Geva Education, Engagement, & Accessibility

For the 2025/26 season we are excited to continue offering the ROC Geva Pass, a partnership with the City of Rochester to provide two hundred complimentary tickets for each of Geva's Subscription Series Productions to city residents in specified zip-codes. Engagement at Geva programs also include Geva *Insights*, Mondays at Geva, the Essie Calhoun Diversity in the Arts Awards, symposiums and more. Dates and events will be announced on the company's website through the season.

Education at Geva will include student matinee performances of *A Christmas Carol, The Woman in Black, Barefoot in the Park*, and *Anastasia*. We will also hold a five-week Musical Theatre Summer Academy conservatory training program for young actors ages 12-18 in July of 2025. Auditions began in March and partial need-based scholarships will be available.

For over twenty years, SUNY Brockport has been a wonderful partner to Geva Theatre in nurturing students through professional artistic experiences in the Geva-Brockport Alliance, and we are thrilled to continue our alliance with them! Each semester, SUNY Brockport students engage with Geva's staff and visiting artists through performance opportunities, internships, show attendance, workshops, facilitated conversations, classes, and more. Many of these

students have gone on to work at Geva as full-time staff members, as performers on our stages, and at theatres across the country.

Other Geva Education programs will center on expanding in-school workshops, classes in Geva's Fielding Stage, college internships in performance and with behind-the-scenes departments at Geva for students at multiple institutions throughout the greater Rochester region, and expanded accessibility.
